August 2, 1955 - January 16, 2016

Beloved son and brother James Milton Lovin passed away at the age of 60 on January 16, 2016 at the Carthage Pavilion Assisted Living Facility in South Carthage, TN. Born August 2, 1955 in Tyler, TX, James was the third child of Robert Milton Loving and Elizabeth Aleftina Lovin.
