



Joe Kenneth Anderson

June 22, 1923 - September 7, 2014

Mr. Joe K. Anderson, age 91, of Gordonsville, TN passed away Sunday, September 7, 2014 at Riverview Regional Medical Center in Carthage, TN. Mr. Joe was born June 22, 1923 in Lancaster, TN, the son of the late Leonard and Maisie Bellar Anderson. He was also preceded in death by his Brother; William "Bill" Anderson and Sister-in-Law, Sarah Fike Anderson. He married Ruth Dindinger on October 8, 1948. Mr. Anderson was a 1940 graduate of Gordonsville High School and later graduated from Tennessee Tech University. He served in the U.S. Army during World War II. Mr. Anderson was Principal at Gordonsville High School from 1960 until 1976, when he became the Smith County Superintendent of Schools until 1984. He was elected Mayor of Gordonsville for three consecutive terms spanning from 1988 to 2000. He was a member of the Lancaster Baptist Church. Mr. Joe was a charter member of the Southside Lions Club and belonged to several other Civic Organizations including; New Middleton Masonic Lodge #249 F&AM, Smith County Bicentennial Committee, Smith County Chamber of Commerce, Smith County Library Board, Upper Cumberland Development District, and Nashville & Eastern Railroad Board. Mr. Anderson is survived by his Wife: Ruth Anderson of Gordonsville, TN. Nephew; William H. "Bill" (Marcia) Anderson of Reno, NV. Niece; Charlotte (Norman) Karin of Buffalo, NY. Funeral Services for Mr. Anderson are scheduled to be conducted on Thursday, September 11, 2014 at 1PM at the Gordonsville Chapel of Bass Funeral Homes with Bro. Jimmy Gregory officiating. Interment will follow in the
